## FY 2018/2019 Budget Request

## **Budget Request Factors**



- Maintains FFS Programs in Non-CHC Zones
- Maintains Existing Service Levels for Participants
- Expands the Total Number of Individuals covered in the OLTL Waivers
  - Provides funds in the HCBS Waiver to add an additional 2,292 people as an alternative to institutional care
  - Provides HCBS to 1,500 additional people with disabilities in the Services to People w/Disability Waiver
  - Provides HCBS to 960 additional people with disabilities in the Attendant Care Waiver
- Reflects Full Year Operation of CHC-MC in SW
- Funds Implementation of CHC in the SE in Jan. 2019
- Reflects Actuarial Sound Rates for CHC-MCO's PH & LTSS
- Transfers portions of Tobacco and Lottery funds from LTC and HCBS Waivers to the CHC Waiver

## **Budget Request Factors**



- Includes Continuation of the IGT Program for County NF's
- Assumes Expansion in LIFE Program
- Includes funds to establish a single responsible entity for Functional Eligibility Determinations





#### **CHC NF Rates**



#### NF Rate Floor for the First 36 Months in CHC Per Zone

- Average of each NF's FFS rates in effect for the four quarters prior to implementation.
- Southeast Calendar Year 2018 quarters.
- The rate floor will not be adjusted over the 36 month timeframe in each zone.
- The CHC-MCOs and NFs may agree to higher rates OR the CHC-MCOs and NFs may agree to lower rates initially under an alternative payment methodology.
- The payments funded through Appendix 4 of the agreement between DHS and each CHC-MCO (relating to nursing facility access to care payments) and Exceptional Durable Medical Equipment (DME) are in addition to a NF's rate.

# FFS COUNTY SAFETY NET Payments Transition to County NF ACCESS TO CARE Payments in CHC

- A FFS county NF safety net payment was established beginning in state fiscal year 2015-16
- CHC implementation began January 1, 2018 in the SW
- CMS' Medicaid managed care regulations prohibit states from directing MCO Plan expenditures or providing pass-through payments
- Upon CHC implementation in each zone, payments are made through managed care in compliance with the CMS Managed Care Final Rule

## FFS COUNTY SAFETY NET Payments Transition to County NF ACCESS TO CARE Payments in CHC

- Appendix 4.II.B of the CHC-MCO Agreements identifies a specific amount for County NF Access to Care that MCO's must use to pay County NFs for NF services and requires the MCOs to demonstrate that the funds were used in accordance with this requirement
  - Appendix 4 funding is intended to help ensure quality of and access to NF services under CHC
  - DHS may not be involved in or provide any direction on how the funds are distributed
  - The CHC-MCOs and PACAH, on behalf of the County NFs, negotiate how the Appendix 4.II.B payments are distributed
  - Appendix 4.II.B also includes funding from the nursing facility assessment (County MDOI)
- DHS and counties continue to execute voluntary IGT agreements for the state fiscal year 2018-19 (July – June)
- The county IGT transfer to the state is still scheduled for May 2019

## County NF Payments



- LH/C, NW & NE FFS 12-month Supplemental County NF Safety Net Payment in June 2019 for July 2018 – June 2019
- Southeast county nursing facilities will receive payments two ways:
  - FFS 6-month Supplemental County Safety Net Payment in June 2019 for July 2018 – Dec. 2018
  - Monthly App. 4 County NF Access to Care payments for Jan. June 2019 service months
- Southwest county nursing facilities will continue to receive negotiated County NF Access to Care payments from CHC-MCOs in FY 2018-19 monthly through App. 4.II.B. for Service Months July 2018 – June 2019
- FY 2017-2018 differences were relatively small in the SW and adjustment will be applied prospectively

### NF Per diem Rates



#### FY 2018-2019

- Publication of proposed rate notice June 23
- CMS approval of the county BAF formula for FYs 2016-2017, 2017-2018, and 2018-2019 – November 8, 2016
- CMS approval of the nonpublic BAF formula for FYs 2017-2018 & 2018-2019 - September 15, 2017
- Act 42 of 2018 provides a 1% increase beginning January 1, 2019
- Estimated publication of final rate notice & Peer group (PG), PG medians and PG price notice – November

#### NF Assessment Program



Resident Day Reporting Form was modified to expand reporting for MCO days.

See the PA NF Assessment and Quarterly Resident Day Reporting Form End User Manual for more information.

#### NF Assessment Program



#### FY 2018-2019

- Publication date of proposed notice June 2
- No change in methodology
- Uniform rate decrease of \$0.61 from FY 2017-2018
- Assessment = Assessment Rate (\$7.40 or \$31.39) x
   NFs historical non-Medicare resident days for CY 2016

#### FY 2018-2019

- Published public notice May 19
- Submitted SPA to CMS August 7
- Received SPA approval from CMS September 21
- Estimated County MDOI per diem \$10.35

### Nonpublic MDOI



#### FY 2018-2019

- Act 40 of 2018
- Published public notice September 22
- Submitted SPA to CMS September 24
- CMS Response due December 23

## Nonpublic MDOI



- For FY 2018-2019, there is a change in payment methodology for qualifying NFs in Phase I of CHC.
  - Payment 1 will use days reported as of 10/31/18 for the resident day quarter 7/01/17-9/30/17
  - Payment 2 will use days reported as of 1/31/19 for the resident day quarter 10/01/17 – 12/31/17

## County Safety Net Payment



#### FY 2018-2019

- County safety net payments are funded by voluntary InterGovernmental Transfers (IGTs)
- Publish Public Notice January 5, 2019
- Submit SPA to CMS January 8, 2019
- CMS response due April 4, 2019

  - NFs in SW Zone No payment
  - NFs in SE Zone Payment for July-Dec 2018
  - NFs in Lehigh/Capital, NW, NE Pmt for July 2018-June 2019
- CHC-MCO Payment (Appendix 4: County NF Access to Care)
  - NFs in SW Zone Payment for July 2018-June 2019
  - NFs in SE Zone Payment for January-June 2019
  - NFs in Lehigh/Capital, NW, NE No payment

## Cost Report (MA-11)



- On September 4, 2018, OLTL Bulletin 03-18-05, Electronic Submission of the Cost Report (MA-11) Form for Reporting Periods Ending 12/31/18 and Thereafter was issued.
- The revised MA-11 and related instructions have been modified to assure that data related to the new CHC program is captured in the cost reporting process.
- Also, additional modifications, which are not related to CHC, were made to certain MA-11 instructions for clarification purposes.

#### **CMP Grants**



#### Long-Term Care Grant Program

- A nursing facility ListServ email was sent out on March 12, 2018, announcing that the Departments of Human Services, Health and Aging will be accepting applications March 15, 2018 through April 15, 2018.
- Total of \$500,000 available
- Forty applications were received
- Fourteen were submitted to CMS on June 27 for review and approval
- Response from CMS due August 13
- To date, OLTL has received 6 approvals and two denials from CMS.
